Avoid close face to face situations	Players, coaching staff,	Maintain social distances. Cross Contamination	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Playing area clearly marked, Coaches to place visual aids ie cones and hoops to aid with player and parent distancing. • Ensure all players have hands sanitised before, during and after session. • There will be no spitting or chewing gum. • No goal group celebrations. • No handshakes with players or coaches • Have a strict hand Hygiene regime. 	Coaches to enforce	Low

First Aid provision	coaching staff, Parents	Cross contamination	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Coaches will have First aid kit. • When administering aid wear gloves • 	Check equipment	Low
What happens if someone develops symptoms					
Suspected case of Covid-19	Players, coaching staff, parents,	Risk of spread of Covid-19 Cross contamination	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Separate the player immediately from the wider group. • Determine if the player needs urgent medical attention and if so call for help (may include an ambulance) and manage any medical emergency • Contact parents and send child home with isolation instructions 	Coach to check	Low
